A cyclone warning Class I is in force in Mauritius. A cyclone warning Class I is in force in Mauritius.

Second cyclone bulletin for Mauritius issued at 1010 hours on Saturday 01 February 2025.

At 1000 hours, the tropical depression was centred at about 540 km to the north-east of Mauritius, that is in latitude 16.9 degrees south and longitude 61.9 degrees east. It is moving in a general west-southwesterly direction at about 20 km/h.

Along this trajectory, the tropical system is approaching Mauritius and as such it constitutes a potential threat to the island.

As per the available numerical models, the environmental conditions are favourable for its further intensification. In the event it becomes a moderate tropical storm, it will be named 'FAIDA'.

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The public in Mauritius is advised to take preliminary precautions.

Cloud bands associated with the tropical system will cross the Island with showers.

Wind will blow from the east south east at a speed of about 30 km/h, strengthening gradually with gusts of the order of 80 km/h.

Sea rough becoming gradually very rough beyond the reefs with swells. It is advised not to venture at sea.

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The next bulletin will be issued at around 1610 hours.
